At least three outside groups have already donated more than \$2 million to Proposition 24, the ballot measure that will allow citizens to ban gay marriage in California. But the measure's supporters say they have far greater resources, including more than \$8 million from the Mormon Church and its most powerful lobbying group, to get out the vote. The opposition, meanwhile, lacks even the meager funding it had in 2008, when Prop 8, an unsuccessful ballot measure that banned gay marriage, passed. Proposition 24 would amend the state constitution to define marriage as between a man and a woman. The argument is that when the state constitution was adopted in 1849, that definition was intended to carry forward into the future. Advocates of Prop 24—which would also affect the legal status of adoption, civil unions, domestic partnerships, surrogate parenting and certain benefits available to gay couples—say that argument is hard to refute. 1.
